The implementation of the European Pillar of Social Rights needs a coherent approach that keeps together national and European legislation providing rights and social protection to atypical and new forms of employment. Among other matters, also the financial backing from EU and national resources to uphold social outcomes all across Europe will be a subject of debate.
